

Asian Tiger Mosquito Aedes albopictus

Native to South-East Asia

Vector for:

- dengue fever
- chikungunyah fever
- zika virus
- and more

Recorded from:

- Regularly intercepted at Brisbane Air and Sea Ports
- Christmas Island and Cocos (Keeling) Islands off North-West of Western Australia
- Most major sea and airports
- Well established in the Torres Strait Islands where it is likely to have arrived on Indonesian fishing boats

Behaviour

Capable of rapidly transmitting diseases because they are aggressive daytime biters and shelter indoors (**near humans**) rather than in wetlands.

Health

Pose a serious risk to human health because they spread diseases such as that local species of mosquitoes cannot.

Distribution

Potentially could include parts of:

- QLD
- NSW
- Victoria
- Tasmania
- SA
- WA
- NT
