# WTF...it's not what you think - Waste, the Facts!

- It is estimated that 129 billion face masks and 65 billion plastic gloves are used and disposed of every month worldwide!
- In February there was 1,776.25 tonnes of waste disposed of and buried at Council's Yeppoon Landfill. This waste comes from areas in our entire Shire.





# What does Council do with...? Tyres

Each year in Australia, millions of tyres reach the end of their life, all tyres received by Council are recycled!

Each year in Australia millions of tyres reach the end of their life, with only 16% of these being domestically recycled. Around two thirds of used tyres in Australia end up in Landfill, or are stockpiled or illegally dumped or have an unknown end fate! Council sends all disposed tyres to a company in Brisbane who recycle these tyres and create new rubber products such as playground soft fall material found in children's play areas all over the country. Such a great example of a productive way to use old tyres.

# Plastic Free CQ - Have you heard?

From 1st September, single-use plastic items will be banned in Queensland!

From 1st September 2021, single-use plastic items such as straws, cutlery, stirrers, plates and bowls will be banned in QLD. It's a massive win for the environment, but it can also be challenging for small businesses to transition.

Jo Stoyel is the new coordinator of Plastic Free CQ, one of the Boomerang Alliance's Plastic Free Places programs. Jo will be working with our local food retailers to help them choose the right alternative products they need, where to find them, and provide support to make the transition quick and easy. It's totally free to businesses (State Government funded) and Jo can also help businesses reduce packaging costs.

It's not just for the banned items either - Jo can help businesses to eliminate all single-use plastics, and certify those that do as Plastic Free Champions! The community can get involved too by supporting and encouraging participating businesses. # Create a Habit Make a Difference!

#### Refuse

Learn to say no. Say no to single use plastic, say no to straws. Say no to items that will immediately go to landfill and stay there – permanently.

#### Reduce

Don't impulse buy and reduce your general consumption.
Don't buy a million types of products and never use them.
Simplify your life too and use multiuse and natural, homemade products. Reduce the amount of general waste you create.

#### Reuse

Stop using disposable products at all. Replace them with more sustainable alternatives. Say no to disposable and yes to reusables! If things break, try to fix and repair them instead.

#### Recycle

After refusing, reducing and reusing, there shouldn't be much left to recycle. Just make sure you clean and separate your recycling properly and recycle them in the correct place.

Turn your kitchen fruit and vegetable scraps into compost or set up your own worm composting bin.
