#### **Boundary Review Update**

In 2020, the Minister for Local Government instructed the Queensland Electoral Commission to investigate changing the boundary of Livingstone Shire Council which would see the three suburbs of Glenlee, Glendale and Rockyview transferred to Rockhampton Regional Council.

Livingstone Shire Council is strongly against this proposal to protect the financial and strategic future of the whole shire.

Potentially, the boundary change could see a significant increase in rates, a reduction of services, or both.

The Queensland Treasury Corporation is currently undertaking its own financial analysis on the impact to both Councils.

After the analysis has been completed, the Minister for Local Government has requested a survey be carried out this year of Rockhampton and Livingstone residents to get their view on the proposed change.

How that survey would be conducted is still being determined by the Boundary Commissioner.

Council will keep residents updated through Get Involved (getinvolved.livingstone.qld.gov.au) about this important issue as more information becomes available.

### MAJOR PROJECT NEWS

#### Works to begin upgrading major road in Cooee Bay

Livingstone Shire Council is due to start work on Stage 2 of upgrades to Matthew Flinders Drive in Cooee Bay, thanks to funding from the Queensland Government.

The estimated \$1.69m reconstruction project, fully funded under the Works for Queensland (W4Q) program, is scheduled to start early this year and is expected to run through to August, weather-permitting.

The project includes renewal of the road pavement and upgrades to stormwater pipes, pits, kerbs and channels.

The section of road to be upgraded runs from Edward Street to Gregory Street.



#### Two rural bridges to be replaced in Livingstone Shire

Two rural timber bridges will be replaced with concrete bridges at Canal Creek thanks to funding from both the Australian Government and Livingstone Shire Council.

The existing single lane bridges on Doonside and Werribee Road will be replaced to improve safety, heavy vehicle access and reduce maintenance.

The Werribee Creek Bridge will be replaced first, followed by the Doonside Bridge, which has already been closed due to safety concerns.

The combined cost is \$1.58m and is 50/50 jointly funded by the Australian Government through the Bridges Renewal Program and by the Livingstone Shire Council.



#### Resource Recovery Centre to be built in 2022

A \$3m Resource Recovery Centre will be built at the Yeppoon Landfill this year. The facility will divert waste from landfill by increasing the level of sorting and capturing of reusable, recyclable, or recoverable materials.

The project includes; a covered check-in, regulated waste storage, and a resource recovery shed connecting to the existing landfill road system.

Landfill volumes at the current rate will fill the existing cell by October 2025 therefore investment in a new cell is crucial. The Resource Recovery Centre will help expand the lifetime of the current cell due to the diversion of waste. Construction is expected to be completed by September.

## Turtle eggs aren't the only eggs on our shorelines that must be protected...

Every summer, 36 shorebird species migrate to Australia from Siberia, Alaska, China and Japan. Some flying a round trip of 30,000km!

Most of these migratory birds lose half of their body weight and stop on Capricorn Coast beaches, islands and wetlands to feed, rest and breed alongside our 18 resident shorebirds.

What's the biggest threat to these endangered and vulnerable birds?

Off-leash dogs...followed closely by human disturbance, driving on beaches, removal of beach scrub, plastics and predators.

Keep an eye out for signs near identified nest sites, like this one at Farnborough Beach, asking dog owners to please keep your dogs on a lead so they don't trample nests or chase exhausted birds that need energy for their return flight.

## Change of hours coming to the Yeppoon Reuse Market

From 1 March 2022, the Yeppoon Reuse Market (formerly the Tip Shop) will be changing their hours to Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday from 8am-4pm.

The Yeppoon Reuse Market is located at the Yeppoon Landfill and recovers good quality items that were destined to become landfill, such as household items and furnishings, collectables, books and toys, sporting equipment, and much more.

Until 1 March, you can still come and grab a bargain on Wednesday and Saturday from 8am-4pm and Sunday from 10am-2pm.

Don't forget, your trash is someone else's treasure! If you have useful goods you don't want, don't bin them, drop them off at the Yeppoon Reuse Market.
