What to do with your Easter Waste


Alfoil wrappings – these can be made into one large bundle (for example a ball) and put into the recycling bin.

Cardboard boxes – please separate any plastic mouldings before flattening the box then add both to the recycle bin. NOTE: If the plastic is soft and doesn't return to its original shape when scrunched it is not suitable for the recycling bin.

Coles or Woolworths have recycle bins for the 'soft' plastics.
