What's the season Look like?

La Niña is under way in the tropical Pacific

The Bureau of Meterology ENSO Outlook has been raised to LA NIÑA.

Key atmospheric and oceanic indicators of the El NiñoSouthern Oscillation (ENSO) show an established La Niña. Models indicate this La Niña event may peak during the spring and return to neutral conditions early in 2023. La Niña events increase the chances of above-average rainfall for northern and eastern Australia during spring and summer.
