Bring your arts project to life!

Have you got an arts project that needs funding?

Local artists and community groups are invited to apply for the latest round of funding under the Regional Arts Development Fund (RADF), to assist with getting their arts projects off the ground.

RADF is a Queensland Government program through an Arts Queensland and Livingstone Shire Council partnership to support local arts and culture.

It helps to promote the significance and value of arts, culture and heritage as the key to supporting diversity and inclusivity, growing stronger regions and providing training, education and employment opportunities for Queensland artists and local

The current round is open to applications from 1-30 November 2023.

Your Water



Council recently adopted its 2023-24 Budget and in an effort to encourage the conservation of water across the Shire, Council has made changes to the water consumption billing tiers and charges, which are reflected in the water notice included with this issue of Reach.

Your water bill is based on the amount of water used per guarter, with charges reflecting usage. Responsible water use is rewarded with lower

Residents and businesses are encouraged to follow the easy water saving tips below to reduce the risk of a high water bill:

- Create a Consumption Log read your water meter regularly!
- Install water-saving fixtures
- Water lawns and gardens in the early morning and late afternoon
- Capture rainwater for outdoor use
- Swap baths for showers
- Don't plant large trees over pipes and mains that run through your
- Regularly maintain automatic watering systems
- Turn taps off gently to lengthen the life of washers
- Check for internal or concealed undergraound leaks if you suspect water consumption is excessive
- Regularly inspect your pool for cracks and signs of leaks
- Install water hammer arrestors if you have a water hammer
- Ensure all building and renovation work is undertaken by a licensed professional and approved by Council



The Emu Park Sewage Treatment Plant upgrade is one step closer to completion, with detailed design work finalised and site works now

This \$6.6 million project, awarded to Liquitek Pty Ltd, encompasses improvements to the aeration and control system, dewatering processes, and the replacement of main sewage treatment tanks.

Funding for the project comes from both Livingstone Shire Council and the Queensland Government, with a commitment of \$4 million from the Local Government Grants and Subsidies Program.

The project is expected to be completed in 2024.
