

ROAD RELATED MANAGEMENT AND FUNCTIONS POLICY (COMMUNITY POLICY)

1. Scope

The Road Related Management and Functions Policy (this 'Policy') applies to:

- a) all roads under Council's jurisdiction;
- b) State-controlled roads on which Council is authorised to exercise its powers; and
- c) roads to be contributed to Council through development works as defined by the *Planning Act 2016*.

2. Purpose

This Policy identifies principles to inform and guide the development of Procedures relating to Council's management of:

- a) roads under its control;
- b) the exercise of Council functions on State-controlled roads; and
- c) roads to be contributed to Council through development works as defined by the *Planning Act 2016*.

4. Definitions

To assist in interpretation, the following definitions shall apply:

Local Government Area	As defined in the <i>Local Government Act 2009</i> .
Road	As defined in the <i>Local Government Act 2009</i> .
State-controlled road	As defined in the <i>Transport Infrastructure Act 1994</i> .

5. Policy Statement

Council has control of all roads in its local government area and is authorised to administer its powers on State-controlled roads.

To exercise its road related functions and facilitate the good rule and governance of its local government area, Council will develop procedures that:

- a) reflect its desire to treat ratepayers equitably in the allocation of funding of road related activities against competing interests and within budget constraints;
- b) are instructive, provide a consistent approach and clear direction in the exercising of its road related functions;
- c) provide measurable and transparent frameworks that facilitate consistent assessments of all community requests; and
- d) provide criteria that:
 - enables community requests to be assessed in a fair and equal manner; and
 - guide responsive and informed decision making which meets community expectations.

6. Changes to this Policy

This Policy is to remain in force until any of the following occur:

1. The related information is amended/replaced; or
2. Other circumstances as determined from time to time by Council.

7. Repeals/Amendments

This Policy repeals Livingstone Shire Council Policy titled:

- a) 'Naming of Infrastructure Assets Policy (v3)';
- b) 'Roadside Memorials Policy (v3)';
- c) 'Rural Addressing Policy (v3)'; and
- d) 'Road Lighting Policy (v3)'.
